Bible reading - Exodus 34:29-35

The Face of Moses Shines

²⁹ Moses came down from Mount Sinai. He had the two tablets of the covenant law in his hands. His face was shining because he had spoken with the Lord. But he didn't realize it. ³⁰ Aaron and all the people of Israel saw Moses. His face was shining. So, they were afraid to come near him. ³¹ But Moses called out to them. So, Aaron and all the leaders of the community came to him. And Moses spoke to them. ³² After that, all the Israelites came near him. And he gave them all the commands the Lord had given him on Mount Sinai.

³³ Moses finished speaking to them. Then he covered his face with a veil. ³⁴ But when he would go to speak with the Lord, he would remove the veil. He would keep it off until he came out. Then he would tell the people what the Lord had commanded. ³⁵ They would see that his face was shining. So, Moses would cover his face with the veil again. He would keep it on until he went in again to speak with the Lord.

Reflecting Radiance

The moon is dark grey in colour and, like the earth, has no light of its own. Its light comes from the sun, meaning that, at any one time, part of the moon is experiencing 'daylight' and part 'night'. In addition, when the moon is at the far side of the earth in its rotation, it is in the earth's shadow and so the sun's light is hidden from it. What we see when we look at the moon is, in fact, its reflection of the sun's light, bouncing off it as if it were shining. Similarly, in this passage, Moses' face-to-face encounters with God result in his face shining – a reflection of God's glory.

Bible reading - Luke 9:28-36

Jesus' Appearance Is Changed

²⁸ About eight days after Jesus said this, he went up on a mountain to pray. He took Peter, John and James with him. ²⁹ As he was praying, the appearance of his face changed. His clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning. ³⁰ Two men, Moses and Elijah, appeared in shining glory. Jesus and the two of them talked together. ³¹ They talked about how he would be leaving them soon. This was going to happen in Jerusalem. ³² Peter and his companions had been very sleepy. But then they became completely awake. They saw Jesus' glory and the two men standing with him. ³³ As the men were leaving Jesus, Peter spoke up. "Master," he said to him, "it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters. One will be for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." Peter didn't really know what he was saying.

³⁴ While he was speaking, a cloud appeared and covered them. The disciples were afraid as they entered the cloud. ³⁵ A voice came from the cloud. It said, "This is my Son, and I have chosen him.

Listen to him." ³⁶ When the voice had spoken, they found that Jesus was alone. The disciples kept quiet about this. They didn't tell anyone at that time what they had seen.

The Mountaintop experience

Meeting God face-to-face outwardly changed both Moses and Jesus. The glow of God's glory shining from Moses and Jesus was evidence of their meeting with God. Those who saw Moses were afraid – the glory of God was too much for them. The disciples up the mountain with Jesus had been impacted by God's glory and wanted to preserve the experience, to stay on the mountain. The Israelites and the disciples experienced God's glory, something they would not forget. Some people have faces that seem to radiate the presence of God. As we deepen our relationship with God, we enable the glow of God's glory to shine from us and through us. The sight of Jesus becoming dazzling white and glowing with the glory of God was witnessed by the disciples Jesus took with him. Their experience of the glory of God made them want to stay in that place. The phrase 'a mountaintop experience' is quite literally describing their experience, a phrase we might use today as we experience God. The disciples were in no hurry to go back to the others, the crowds, their everyday life. What about us? Would we rather look for and stay on our 'mountaintop'? Perhaps, like the disciples, we are encouraged to carry this experience with us as we return to everyday life, strengthened and affirmed as we meet daily joys and challenges.

The mountaintop experience of the disciples in our Gospel passage was one they wanted to prolong. The closeness of God, the amazing things they saw, the depth of spiritual awareness were all things they wanted to hold onto. They had been taken up the mountain by Jesus away from the crowds and the distractions of everyday life. Their experience must have filled them with awe and a new awareness of the power and glory of God; they wanted to stay in that place, in that moment, with that experience. No troubles, no problems, no woes. But Jesus leads them back down the mountain, back to the other disciples, back to the crowds, back to the struggles and mess of everyday life. Their secret mountaintop experience was over, but the effect of it on their lives was not. It was something to carry around and remember when things got tough, an encouragement to trust Jesus even when they didn't know what was happening.

When we experience the closeness of God, his power, his glory, or have a heightened awareness of his presence (as Moses did too, in our reading from Exodus), we often want to stay in that place. Our faith is strengthened in these special moments, and we can be reluctant to leave. We, like the disciples, want to prolong this experience.

Seeking mountaintop experiences may become a priority in our spiritual lives. We can continually look for such experiences and be disappointed when we are unable to find them. We may feel disappointed that we cannot always experience the closeness of God and the glory of his presence. The problems and distractions of life and the people around us can weigh us down and we long to be back up the mountain, face-to-face with God. But this kind of encounter is not meant to be a permanent state of being or a place where we can stay. We are called by Christ to be his people in the world, and to walk and work in the messiness of everyday life.

Our deep spiritual experiences are given to strengthen us and prepare us to live our lives as Christ's people. We are affirmed and aware in a deeper way of our relationship with the God who loves us. Our connection with the world in which we live means that we will have doubts and anxiety. Having spent time in God's presence prepares us for this and encourages us to take opportunities as they are given to meet with him again and again.

With the power of the Holy Spirit let our hands and feet reach out as our faces shine and radiate that special love that comes from you.
